What starts out in preschool/Kindergarten as making pretty designs with pattern blocks eventually leads to skip counting, repeated addition (and therefore multiplication and division), algebraic reasoning, and beyond! So it's important that we provide them with a solid foundation. Don't be surprised to see many types of work coming home that display a variety of different patterns (AB, ABB, ABC, ABBC).
