The month of February was a busy one, which included special days like Groundhog Day, Valentine's Day, Lunar New Year, Family Day and Pink Shirt Day. Children are still enjoying puzzles and working on pre-writing skills such as pin punching, lacing and beading. Some have been busy tracing the sandpaper numbers and letters and others are building words and reading from a set of early readers.

Valentine's Day was different yet meaningful this year as the children hand-crafted Valentines cards for each other and put them in Valentines bags which they took home at the end of the week. They made heart sun catchers and did some sewing around hearts. They

brought out the best of themselves at circle time where they took turns sharkind and caring thoughts towards each other. We explored fire safety using the activities in our Play Safe be Safe kit and watched a short video. We learned about Lunar New Years by reading books, making a craft and Teacher Arti incorporated the animals of the Chinese zodiac signs into her yoga class. In Spanish, children practiced numbers 1-10 and named colors. Next month Teacher Sarah plans to introduce the names of various animals.

Outside, children are having fun with our new rakes and shovels and everyone wants to try the new tricycle. The fire and recycle trucks that Teacher Sarah donated are very popular as well! We did a big refresh in the classroom on the PD day and on Pink Shirt Day we talked about what it means to be kind, respectful, and accepting.

Looking ahead, we will learn about food and nutrition this month by borrowing some learning bins from the Langley Child Care Resource and Referral Center. Although St. Patrick's Day will be on March 17th, we will bring out our St. Patrick's Day activities on the last days before spring break which includes shamrocks, crafts and coloring the Irish flag.
