Spring Life Cycles at Pathway

What an exciting time we had with our Botany Unit. We have many plants in our classroom, so the children took cuttings from them and, as I write, the roots are starting to appear. The children are anxious to plant them. We also had live tulips in class so they learnt about parts of a flower. The children explored the texture of flowers and used a magnifying glass to have a closer look.

Also, we covered Earth Day and spoke about the importance of caring for our world and the impact of reduce, recycling and reusing. For one of our crafts, "Small hands can change the World", we painted the children's hands, green for the earth and blue for the ocean whilst talking to them about how we can all be kind to our earth. We then placed their handprints onto a large earth which is now on display in our classroom.

We'll celebrate the momentous occasion of the crowning of King Charles III on May 6th by having a Coronation Tea Party on Friday, May 5th. We will be making decorations to display in our classroom, playing games to mark this historic event. All the children are encouraged to wear the colours red, white, and blue. We will be serving pink lemonade and enjoying a colourful snack of Strawberries, Blueberries and Crackers. Those parents, who have children with allergies, please speak with one of the teachers regarding any concerns you may have regarding the snacks.

The children are all excited to learn about butterflies and their life cycle when they arrive. We will also have some exciting lessons on Dinosaurs this month.

The full day children planted cat grass last month. They have been caring for plants as well as observing the growth of the grass. They also did a flower craft using a painted dot design. In recognition of Earth Day, the children did a blue and green paper plate craft. This month they will study volcanos as well as herbivorous and carnivorous dinosaurs.

Kindergarten News

May is upon us and the kindergarten children love it outdoors. We are enjoying some fun outdoor games in the playground. We will be exploring life cycles in our Kindergarten class this month. Children get to watch the magical transformation from a caterpillar to a butterfly. We will be making daily observations and understand their transition into butterflies through a variety of activities. We will also read the classic book "A very hungry caterpillar" by Eric Carle.

In literacy, we will be focusing on reading comprehension this month. This is a complex higher-level thinking skill, but children from a very early age can begin thinking about what they have just read and tell you what a story is about. When children read, they must turn their "minds on" and actively think about the meaning of what they are reading.

We will also be exploring stories, poems and songs from First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities. In geography this month we will discuss our world and continents using Montessori world maps. Children will also look at the Canadian map and learn the names of the provinces. In math, children will learn how to tell time. We will be doing some fun activities to understand the basic concepts of time.
