Some of the new activities that the children are enjoying in the Practical Life area is pouring water with a funnel, using an eye dropper, grinding with a mortar and pistil and wood and mirror polishing. Other activities being practiced are tracing numbers & letters in the sand tray, creating words with the moveable alphabets and working on geography puzzle maps.

An ongoing Montessori practice we strive to instill is "Grace and Courtesy". Some examples are being quiet and paying attention when someone else is talking and learning not to interrupt. We encourage children to put their hand on our arm or shoulder and wait when the teacher is

busy or talking to someone else. We have a peace flower which is sometimes used when there is a conflict or someone is upset. Other points of interest being taught are making eye contact, table manners, blowing one's nose, learning to stand in line, taking turns, listening to directions, speaking softly, greetings, being kind and giving thanks.

At Easter time we made crafts such as sun catchers, bunny hats, and eggs in a basket. We also enjoyed an Easter egg hunt out in the playground. Their favorite game was "Sleeping Bunnies" and at Storytime they enjoyed "Angela's Airplane" & "The Paper Bag Princess" by Robert Munsch.

Field Trip/Professional Dev Day - there will be no class on Friday May 19th. We will be using this day for both a field trip and a professional development day. We are still waiting for field trip details and will keep you posted.

For Earth Day children created beautiful earth day crafts with a focus on "reuse, reduce and recycle". In science they made butter out of heavy whipping cream. All the children helped shake the jar while singing "Shake it, shake it, shake it, shake it all you can. Shake it like a milkshake and pass it to your friend." They observed how it changed from whipped cream into butter.
